Dear Parents / Guardians

### **Sports Day 2022**

I am delighted to inform you that our annual Sports Day will be held on **Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> July 2022**. All students in Years 7-10 are expected to attend and participate in the activities on site at the Academy and off- site at Tudor Grange Leisure Centre (Norman Green athletics track).

Sports Day is traditionally a highlight on the Academy calendar and it is our intention to make this year's the best yet following an academic year of limited sporting opportunities! This year students will be involved in Sports Day activities all day and will have the opportunity to participate in a range of non-traditional activities as well as the more traditional track and field events.

We have carefully considered this event and have liaised with Pharos, our risk assessment advisors to ensure that the plans for the day continue to minimize risk of COVID transmission. Additional measures we will be taking:

- Continuing to keep year groups separated
- Cleaning of equipment in between year groups
- Keeping students outside (there will only be emergency access to the toilets at the athletics track)
- Asking students to make use of personal hand sanitisers regularly throughout the day

All students should arrive to the Academy on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> July 2022 in their **full PE kit and register with their RSHE tutor in their normal RSHE room for that day**. Other sports wear (including non-regulation hoodies) will not be permitted.

All students in years 7 and 8 will spend the morning at Norman Green athletics track, where they will have the opportunity to compete in track and field events to score points for their college. Every student will have the opportunity to sign up to compete in an event during their Physical Education lessons. In the afternoon, all Year 7 and 8 students will be required to participate in a range of sports activities at the academy in their tutor groups. The focus of the non-traditional sports will be on participation and enjoyment (although students will still be competing to gain points for their tutor group).

Students in years 9 and 10 will start their day at the Academy and will take part in the track and field events (at Norman Green athletics track) in the afternoon. All year groups will have the same fantastic offer of activities.

We advise all students to be prepared for the day, bringing water, sun cream and a waterproof jacket. In the event of poor weather, students will follow their normal school timetable.
