During the first few weeks of the Autumn Term Year 11 and Year 10 were taken to see the RSC's latest production of Macbeth. As a set text for their GCSE's it was great to welcome 200 students along to this experience; and what an experience they had.

The lead role played by Reuben Joseph was executed perfectly (excuse the pun!) His movement on stage was electric and the relationship between him and Lady Macbeth was compelling to watch. Performing the Porter was Alison Peebles, cast wonderfully as the comedic interlude following the murder of King Duncan- or in our production Queen Duncan. The Porter scene was newly written making the jokes current and at times extremely near to the knuckle.

The set was sparse and everyday objects used to connote the growing turmoil of the 'butcher' Macbeth. The aerobatics of the witches made them appear as frightening and captured the very essence of the supernatural. Each witch contorting their bodies in a way only a convincing witch ever could! The most impactful moment for many of the students, was the delivery of Macbeth's famous 'Tomorrow and tomorrow and tomorrow' speech, touchingly performed on stage with absolute silence from the audience- so we could all drink in the sorrowful end to this once great warrior.
