




Expected Standards German Year 11

Year 11(Autumn 1) - Jobs and careers

Linguistic Competence

- Express future plans—post 16 and post 18
- Discuss work experience including part time jobs
- Talk about future job wishes
- Give advantages and disadvantages of different professions

Application of Grammar

- Using different ways to discuss future plans
 - Using infinitive expressions with *zu*

Year 11 (Autumn 2) - social issues

Linguistic Competence

- Talk about charity work
- Discuss volunteering abroad
- Talk about healthy lifestyles including exercise and diet
- Discuss addictions e.g. drinking / drugs

- Using a range of modal verbs

Year 11 (Spring 1) - Global issues

Linguistic Competence

- Adjectival endings after *etwas, nichts, viel, wenig, alles*
