## **Top Tips for Geography Revision**

- Buy a copy of the CGP revision guide letters have been handed out this year for you to purchase off ParentPay
- Focus on applying knowledge to exam questions. Re-answer questions you have done before and try to improve your mark
- Practice the structure of your exam answers in timed conditions e.g. PEEL structure (Point, Evidence, Explain, Link)
- Make sure you understand the different command words so you are answering the question properly e.g. assess, evaluate, analyse!
- Mind-maps, revision clocks and flash cards are useful revision tools there will be chance for you to complete these with the help of your teacher.
- Ensure you know your case studies it is not good enough to just know the name, location and date of them! Try to produce an A5 summary sheet for each case study.
