

You first encountered Robert Louis Stevenson's seminal gothic novella in year 9, when you gained an understanding of the plot. As you revisit the text in year 10, you will analyse the writer's use of language and structure in more detail, considering his intentions and the context behind the text. You will use your deepened understanding of character, theme and setting as you begin to respond to GCSE question tasks, focusing on the importance of creating a cohesive line of argument in your own analytical writing, as you grapple with Stevenson's ideas about the nature of good and evil.
