Online

1. Go to www.languagesonline.org.uk (free and no need to register) Select the language that you study and complete self-correcting activities (really good for grammar practice!)
2. Go to www.senecalearning.com (free but you need to create an account) Self-correcting exercises on a huge range of topics related to the KS3 / GCSE course that you are studying
3. If you have purchased an account via parent pay go to www.pearsonactivelearn.com and complete self-correcting listening and reading tasks that follow the course books that we use in lessons.
4. Go to www.teachitlanguages.co.uk. Access the language you are currently studying and complete the worksheets available for the topic you are covering. You will have to register but access to everything is currently free.
5. Go to www.lightbulblanguages.co.uk and select the language you study from the bar on the left hand side of the screen. You can then select your level (KS3 or KS4) and download fun puzzles to complete.
6. Go to www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize and select either GCSE or KS3 and then the language you study. You can work by skill (listening, reading, writing or speaking) or by topic area.
7. Go to www.twinkl.co.uk and hover over KS3/KS4. From here you will be able to select your language and browse the topics by category for resources. You will need to register for a free account.
8. Go to www.quizlet.com/en-gb. You will need to create a free account. Click “sign up” to do this. Type in the title of the topic you are currently studying from your progress check book or knowledge organiser. This will allow you to create flashcards and play games in order to memorise the vocab you are working on. We recommend 5 minutes of this a day.
9. Go to <https://www.memrise.com/>. You will need to create a free account. Click “sign up” to do this. Choose your language and level and practise learning vocabulary.
10. <https://www.arsenaldoubleclub.co.uk/resources/> sign up and learn your language with some Premier League footballers!

1. Find a popular song in French/Spanish/German and learn the lyrics to it. Use www.lyricstraining.com to test your knowledge.
2. Find a popular dish from French/ Spanish or German cuisine. Make it at home and take a picture of the result.
3. Find some information about a famous monument in France, Germany or Spain. Make a model of it from pasta/straw/Lego and take a picture of your creation!
4. Watch your favourite TV programme on Netflix with the audio turned to French/German or Spanish (hover over the screen and click audio > then choose your language. Yes this even works for TV programmes made in English originally!). Make a note of 10 new pieces of vocabulary you learn.
5. Research a part of the world that speaks French/German/Spanish that isn't France/Germany/Spain - how did they end up speaking that language?
6. Create a quiz on Kahoot about a French/German/Spanish topic. Use your progress check books and knowledge organisers to help.
7. Design an outfit for a special occasion and label it in the language you are learning. You can either draw your outfit or create a collage from magazines and newspapers.
8. Design your own French/German/Spanish town or city and label the places in your target language. You can include a short description too.
9. Go to TripAdvisor. Find the highest-rated reviews for a French/German/Spanish tourist destination in the native language, then read them and translate as much as you can into English.
10. Discover some French/German/Spanish YouTubers / instagrammers and subscribe to them!
11. Find engaging and interesting ways to revise your progress checks/vocab lists/knowledge organisers to maintain your knowledge.
