#### **Andrew Tate**

You will likely be aware of the recent news coverage and arrest of Andrew Tate. Before Christmas, in recognition of the potential risk his ideology and other negative social media influencers pose to students at Tudor Grange, we started to roll out two lessons to all students in years 7-11 on combatting violence and misogyny through Tudor Habits and Values. We have shared with students some of the concerning facts about Andrew Tate's behaviour and his treatment of women (age appropriate) and encouraged students to reflect upon who they want to be, their own values and the values of their friends.

We wanted to share some of the material that we used to create our lessons with you so that, if you wish to, you can follow up these lesson at with your child at home. We believe that this is an important step, especially in the light of the fact that initial feedback from teachers is that a number of students, boys especially, have reported being targeted with pro-Andrew Tate material through apps such as Tiki Tok. We always want to improve our provision; we will be sharing a survey with students so that we can collate their reflections on those lessons.
