What Exam Board do I follow? AQA

Year 10 & 11 course format and assessment:

Students explore all four assessment objectives within the project journey:

AO1: Develop ideas through investigations, demonstrating critical understanding of sources.

AO2: Refine work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.

AO3: Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions as work progresses.

AO4: Present a personal and meaningful response that realises intentions and demonstrates understanding of visual language.

- Coursework project: (Select from 2 titles) A sustained project evidencing the journey from initial engagement to the realisation of intentions which shows coverage of the four assessment objectives. (No time limit, 96 marks, 60% of GCSE)
- Externally Set Assignment: Set by the exam board (Preparatory period followed by 10 hours of supervised time, 96 marks, 40% of GCSE)

What extra support will school offer?

During year 11, students will have access to weekly study supports led by Photography department staff (Tuesdays 3-4).

On the students TEAMS area there is a copy of the exam specification and visual examples of past students' projects (full range of grades).

This folder also contains a GCSE handbook which guides students through each of the assessment objectives with key words, Artist's analysis guides and suggested project format.
