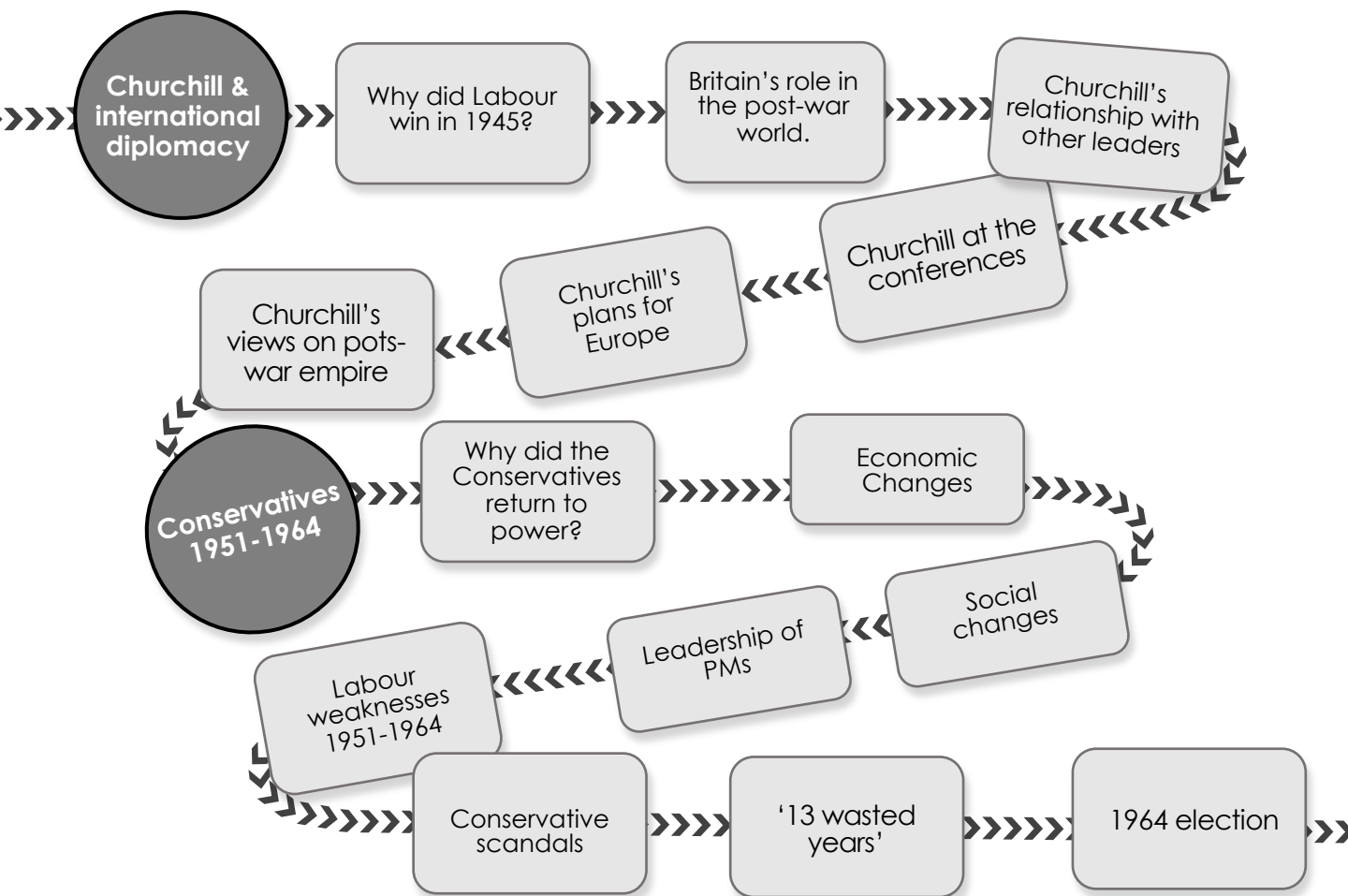
OCR Y113: Britain 1930-1997

Spring Term

1930-1951: Winston Churchill case study & Conservative dominance 1951-1964:

We will continue our case study of Churchill, with a focus on his post-war career as a leading international diplomat. With a focus on the emerging Cold War, Indian independence and the shifting sands of British colonialism, we will have a confident grasp of Britain in 1950. Once finished, we begin our chronological study starting with Churchill's return to power in 1951, which begins a period of dominance for the Conservatives.

During this process you will develop your understanding of what it means to be a **historian**, including the different **skills** and **processes** involved. The main skill for this half-term will be **critically analysing sources**, in preparation for our 30 mark question.



PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT: You will continue your in-depth case study of Churchill, now as a leading international statesman. This is the last topic of the case study, which will be followed by the chronological study, beginning with Churchill's re-election as prime minister in October 1951.

HISTORY VOCABULARY: independence, apartheid, decolonisation, decline, sleaze, satire, deference, affluence.
