
OCR Y113: Britain 1930-1997

Summer Term

1964-1970 Wilson government

We will begin our study in 1964, exploring how the Labour Party was able to overturn the large majority the Conservatives obtained under Macmillan in 1959. We will observe the social, political and economic changes that appear rapid in the period of the 1960s. Then, moving from the social liberal 1960s to the economic tumultuous 1970s, we see Britain in decline and how both parties face challenges.

During this process you will develop your understanding of what it means to be a **historian**, including the different **skills** and **processes** involved. The main skill for this half-term will be **our 20 mark essay question**, where key chronological detail is woven with critical analysis to reach a judgement.



PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT: You will explore some of the most significant social reforms in recent British history, from the decriminalisation of male homosexuality; the liberalising of divorce and abortion, to the beginning of multicultural and racially-tolerant Britain. Modern Britain of today will unfold before us.
