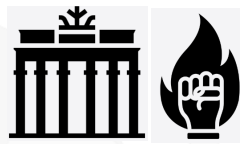

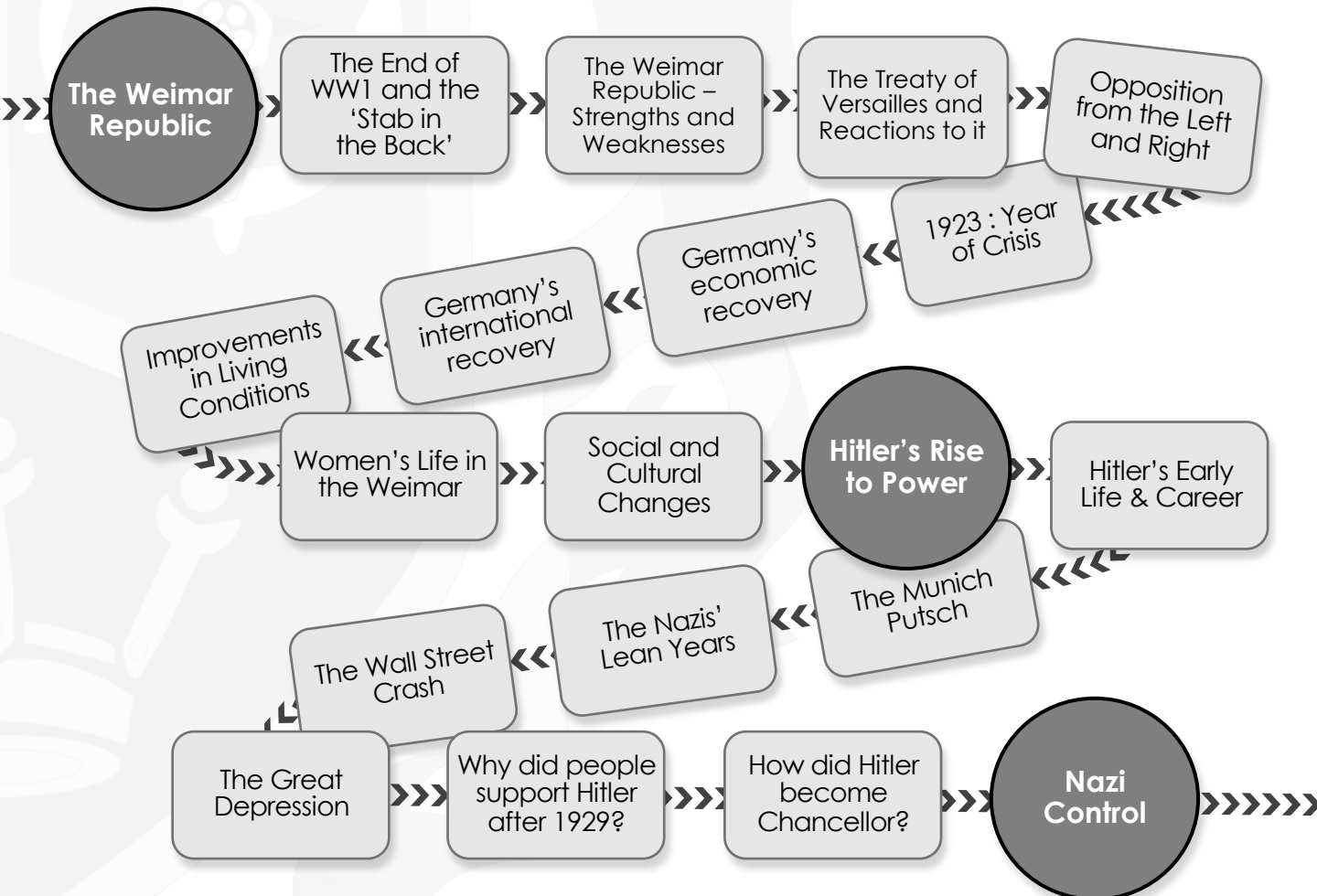


Year 11: Weimar and Nazi Germany

Autumn Term

You are going to develop your understanding of how the German people tried to create the **perfect democracy** with the **Weimar Republic**, and the factors that contributed to its **demise**. This includes the **mistakes made by the government** itself and **events beyond its control**. As part of this we will also look at what life was like for **different groups of people**. In this way you will develop your understanding of the key characteristics of a **democracy** and how democracy can be **threatened**.

You're going to develop your source skills; specifically making **inferences** and **analysing utility**. You are also going to build your confidence when working with **interpretations**, thinking about how and why they **differ**, and **evaluating** the **extent** you **agree** with the views they present. In this way, there are strong careers links to **research** and **project managers**.



TUDOR HABITS: As part of this topic, you will develop your understanding of how lack of **tolerance** can lead to conflict, as well as how **democracy** can be threatened and eroded. You will also investigate what the consequences of this can be for the citizens of the countries involved.
