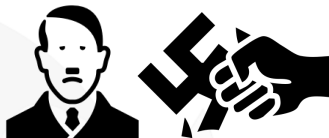

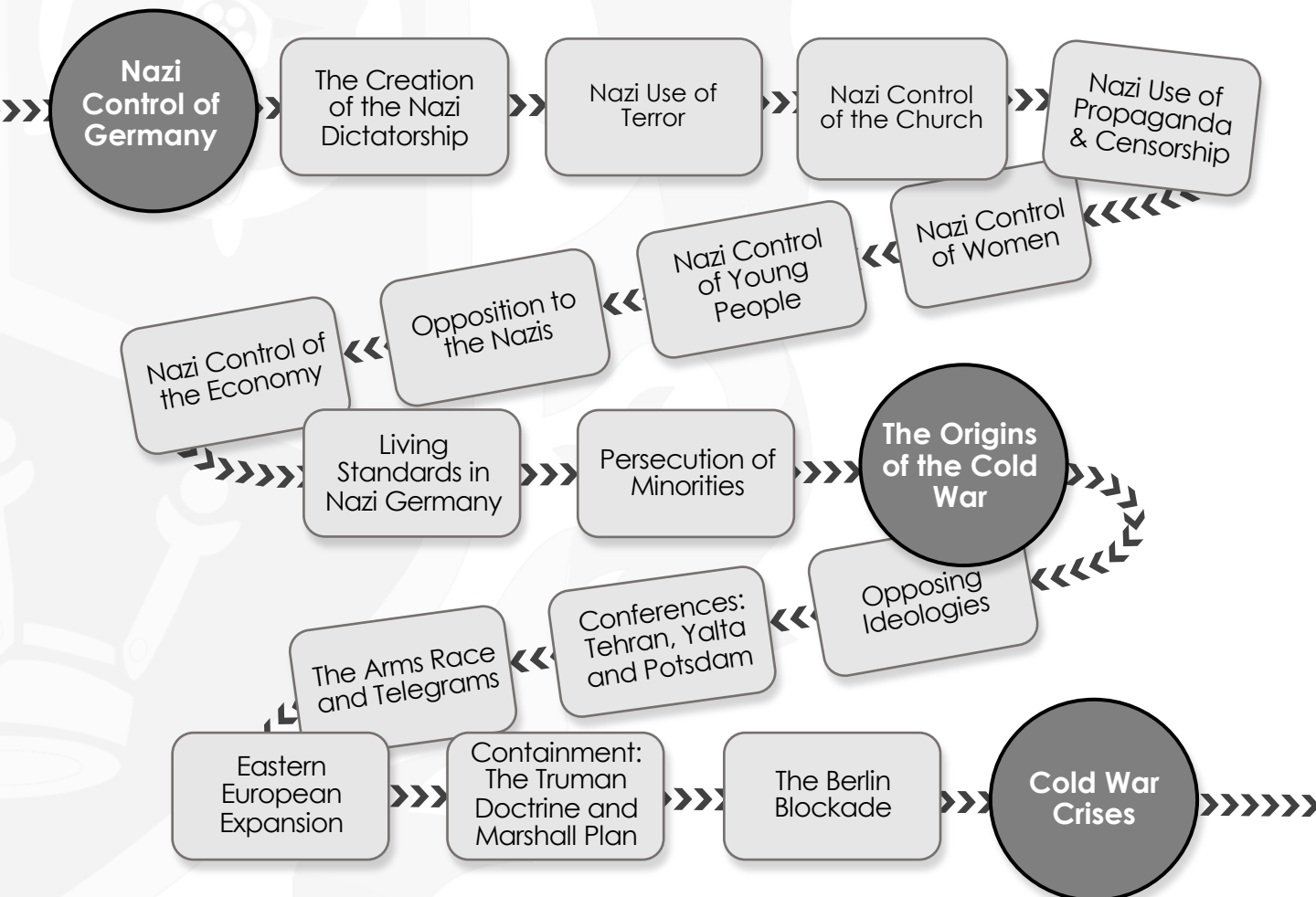


## Year 11: Weimar and Nazi Germany

### Spring Term

You are going to develop your understanding of what **life in Nazi Germany** was like for different groups of people. You will also look at how the Nazis sought to keep **control** of the **dictatorship** they created, through **propaganda** and **terror**. In this way you will develop your understanding of the key characteristics of a **dictatorship**.

You're going to develop your source skills; specifically making **inferences** and **analysing utility**. You are also going to build your confidence when working with **interpretations**, thinking about how and why they **differ**, and **evaluating** the **extent** you **agree** with the views they present. In this way, there are strong career links to **research** and **project managers**.



**TUDOR HABITS:** As part of this topic, you will develop your understanding of how lack of **unity** and **tolerance** can lead to conflict, as well as how **democracy** can be threatened and eroded. You will also investigate what the consequences of this can be for the citizens of the countries involved.
