





What is the end goal of this vision and ethos?

Standards and Expectations – Mr Bargh

Attendance

It is compulsory for all students to attend all tutor times, assemblies, timetabled lessons, supervised study periods, TG societies and enrichment electives.

All year 12 students are expected to be school from 8.35 until the end of their lessons. If they do not have any lessons in an afternoon they may leave at 2pm.

Attendance

However, we understand that there are going to times when students are absent for differing reasons.

"What do I do if my child is too ill to attend school."

Attendance

"What happens if a student has no lessons in the afternoon?" If a student has no lessons from 2pm onwards and they wish to leave, then they can sign out outside Mrs Keiser's office. If they leave and don't sign out then this contravenes safeguarding and fire regulations.

"What happens if a student arrives late?"

If tutor time is still taking place, students must go straight to their tutor room to be registered. If students arrive after tutor time, they must sign in outside Mrs Keiser's office before heading to their first lesson. Once their swipe cards are activated they will sign in via this method.

Attendance

"What should a student do if they need to request absence from school for something planned such as an orthodontist appointment or to book time off for a driving test?"

Part Time Work

We understand that students will begin to start part time work and we actively support this. We understand how paid employment can prepare students for their university applications and life in the wider world.

However, we just ask that students limit their part time employment to ensure that it does not interfere with school, lessons and independent work time.

Students should not be requesting time off school to start shifts in paid employment.

Driving Lessons

Again, we appreciate that students will begin to learn to drive in year 12 and again, we fully support this process. Please could we ask that students do not plan driving lessons for in the school day. Driving lessons should be planned after their school day concludes.

However, <mark>it is appropriate to ask for time of to complete the driving theory test or complete the final driving test.</mark>

Dress Code

We are a school sixth form and with this comes the requirement to follow the explicit dress code outlined on our website.

This is essentially a <mark>charcoal suit for male students with white shirt, sixth form tie and smart shoes.</mark>

Female students should also wear a charcoal suit jacket and then matching tailored skirt or trousers depending on their preference.

Students may wear plain dark coloured jumpers under their suit but must have their suit jacket with them at all times.

No hoodies.

Smart, professional shoes. No trainers.



Student Conduct

We want our sixth form to be a <mark>professional environment.</mark> We expect all student conduct to be respectful to all members of our school community.

We want students to develop relationships with all members of the school community that are defined by respect and kindness.

Phones & Headphones

Students are allowed to have phones with them in sixth form.

They may use them in the sixth form specific areas such as sixth form café, quiet room and WG1.

Some teachers may ask students to use them in lessons.

Students shouldn't be using them/having them on show in lessons and non-sixth form areas as students in lower school are not allowed them.



Focus on Praise and Positivity

Wave 1 - 6th Form Praise Postcard

Teachers can praise student work, attitude, conduct and learning habits by awarding them a praise postcard. Students will get an email home as well as a physical postcard with a treat inside.

Wave 2 - Praise Letter

For going above and beyond or consistently outstanding work, teachers can submit a praise letter for students. This will result in a letter celebrating the students' outstanding conduct.

Conduct Sanctions

Wave 1 – Initial Conversations

If a student's conduct does not meet our expectations, the first wave of sanctions is for teachers to talk to students about their behaviour.

Wave 2 – Yellow Card

Yellow cards act as reminders that a standard has not been met and should be corrected going forward. Appropriate actions for yellow cards might be a student arriving late to a lesson on a single occasion, completing homework to an unacceptable standard or breaking uniform standards.





Conduct Sanctions

Wave 3 – Compulsory Sixth Form Study Session: Subject (NEW for 2023)

Compulsory study sessions may be assigned if a more significant sanction is required by subject teachers, such as repeatedly missing homework or persistently arriving late to a lesson.

'Compulsory Study Session: Subject' will be held at a convenient time for both the student and staff member.


Wave 4 – Compulsory Sixth Form Study Session: Sixth Form (<u>NEW</u> for 2023)

Compulsory study sessions for sixth form are designed for central sixth form issues like persistent lateness to tutor time/assembly, uniform breaches and truancy to lessons/tutor time.

'Compulsory Study Session: Sixth Form' will be held weekly on Wednesday afternoons between 3-4pm and staffed by the sixth form team.

Post 16 Bursary

- With no pupil premium status in sixth form, students may claim for financial assistance if they require support.
- A criteria and application form is outlined on sixth form part of academy website.
- Items that are valid to purchase form the bursary are school equipment, books, sixth form uniform, bus passes and anything that is essential for the student to take part in full time education.




Independent Study – Reading Widely and Super-Curricular

• The engagement with academic reading/listening not only supports student success in their subjects where they engage with complex vocabulary and material but it also prepares them for education beyond school.


• We will support this process through subject areas and tutor time programme but as much independent reading/listening as possible is best for student development.
