

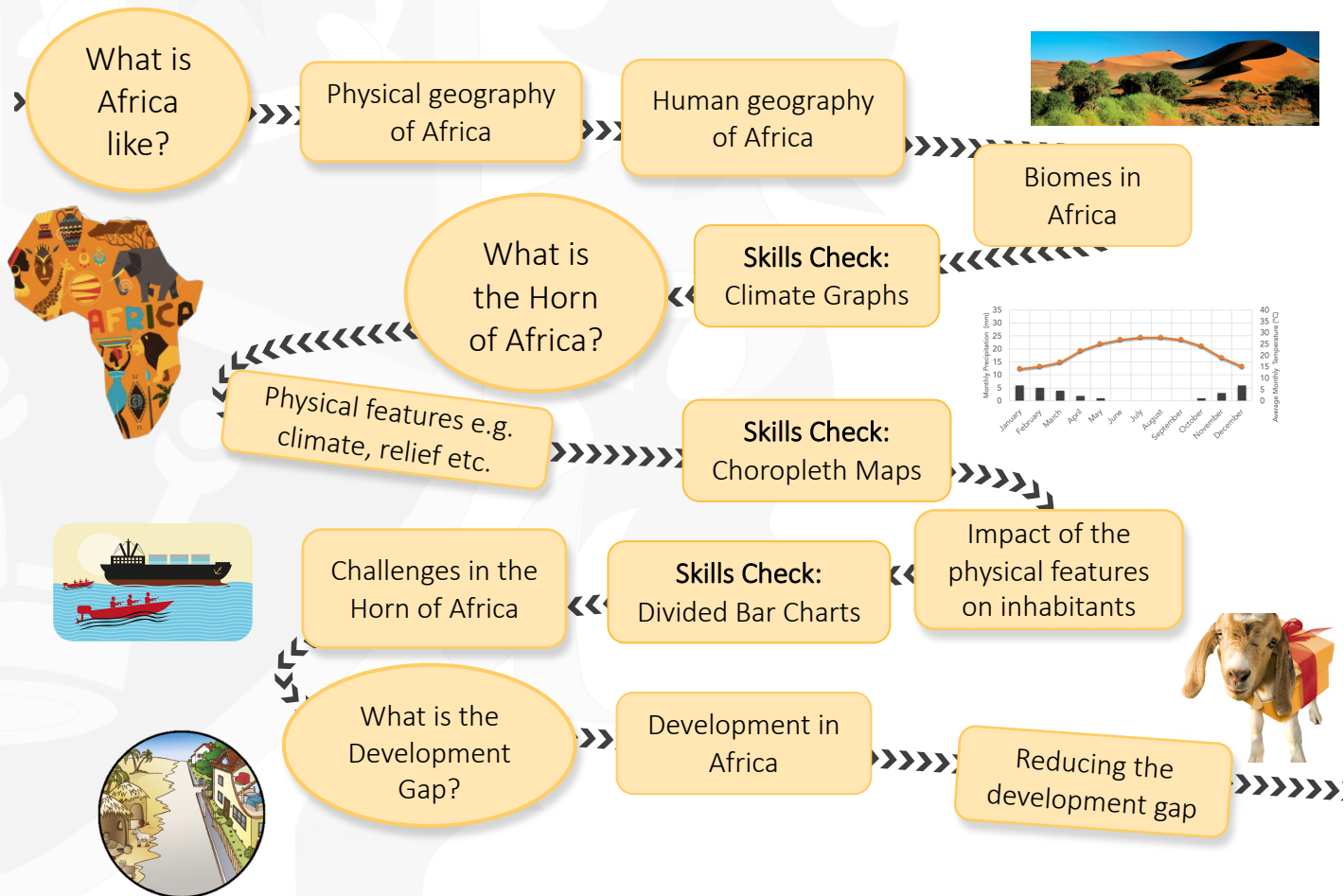

Contrasting Continent - Africa

Understanding the world around us is a key concept of geography – think back to the 3 areas we looked at in your previous Year 7 ‘My Place in the World’ topic. There are a lot of misconceptions associated with the continent of Africa, and this topic will address those through looking at Africa as a whole before zooming in on the **Horn of Africa**; a region very different to that of any region in the UK! You will again look at the **human** and **physical** geography, and how these are often interlinked and what this means for the people who live there. You will then be exposed to one of the key threads of how the wealth of a country generally improves the quality of life of its inhabitants. We have partially encountered this in Year 7 ‘Fantastic Places - Hot Deserts’, but it will also be woven into many future topics such as Year 8 ‘Challenging Cities’ and Year 9 ‘Development in Uganda’.
