# **Year 11 Subject Parents' Evening – Maths**

Your child will be taking their GCSE examination in May/June 2024. The examination board is Edexcel, and the paper reference is 1MA1. In lessons your child will be completing regular practice GCSE assessments and working specifically on the areas that they need to target.

Ofqual is currently seeking views on whether the use of formulae sheets and revised equation sheets as used in 2022 and 2023 in GCSE mathematics, physics and combined science should be continued for students taking these exams in 2024. As soon as we have further information we will share this with you.

### Sources of Help

It is essential that in addition to completing all mathematics homework, your child independently revises for their GCSE assessments at home throughout this year. We would suggest a minimum of one extra hour per week is spent on this, with more time spent as the final examination gets closer.



## **Revision Techniques and Advice**

Remember, maths is a **doing** subject. The best way to progress is to try some questions on a topic, revise that topic, revisit questions that you struggled with, and go back to your notes again when you struggle.



Use the tools you receive after every trust assessment; your print outs following each assessment give you a breakdown of each topic that you need to revise, and how much of a priority it should be. If you have done well on a topic, revising it will not have as much impact as revising a topic that you haven't done as well on.
