
LEARNING JOURNEY GEOGRAPHY 1



Extreme Weather USA

Year 9 Autumn Half Term 1

You are going to develop your knowledge of the United States of America (USA) by exploring its climate zones and subsequent extreme weather patterns. This topic aims to introduce you to the concept of extreme weather (a crucial element of Key Stage 4 Geography) and allow you to see the ways in which this affects the USA. You will gain an opportunity to explore a variety of examples using real life case studies to exemplify this. You will draw on your prior knowledge and skills from our Year 7 topic 'My Place in the World' and learn new skills to appropriately equip you for future study of Geography such as drawing choropleth maps, describing geographical locations and evaluating the responses to extreme weather events.
