

The penultimate topic of Key Stage 3 sees us return to UK geography, recapping famous rivers and mountain ranges from the Year 7 'My Place in the World' topic but also building on this to see how this impacts the nearby towns and cities. There are many cross-curricular links in this topic, particularly looking at the Hydrological Cycle which will have been studied in science. This topic will also aim to introduce using diagrams to support your answers, particularly when explaining how landforms are created from **source** to **mouth**. This skill will then be further developed in the final topic 'Cracking Coasts' where you will be able to utilise your knowledge of processes and the skill of drawing annotated diagrams to assist you when learning about coastal landforms.
