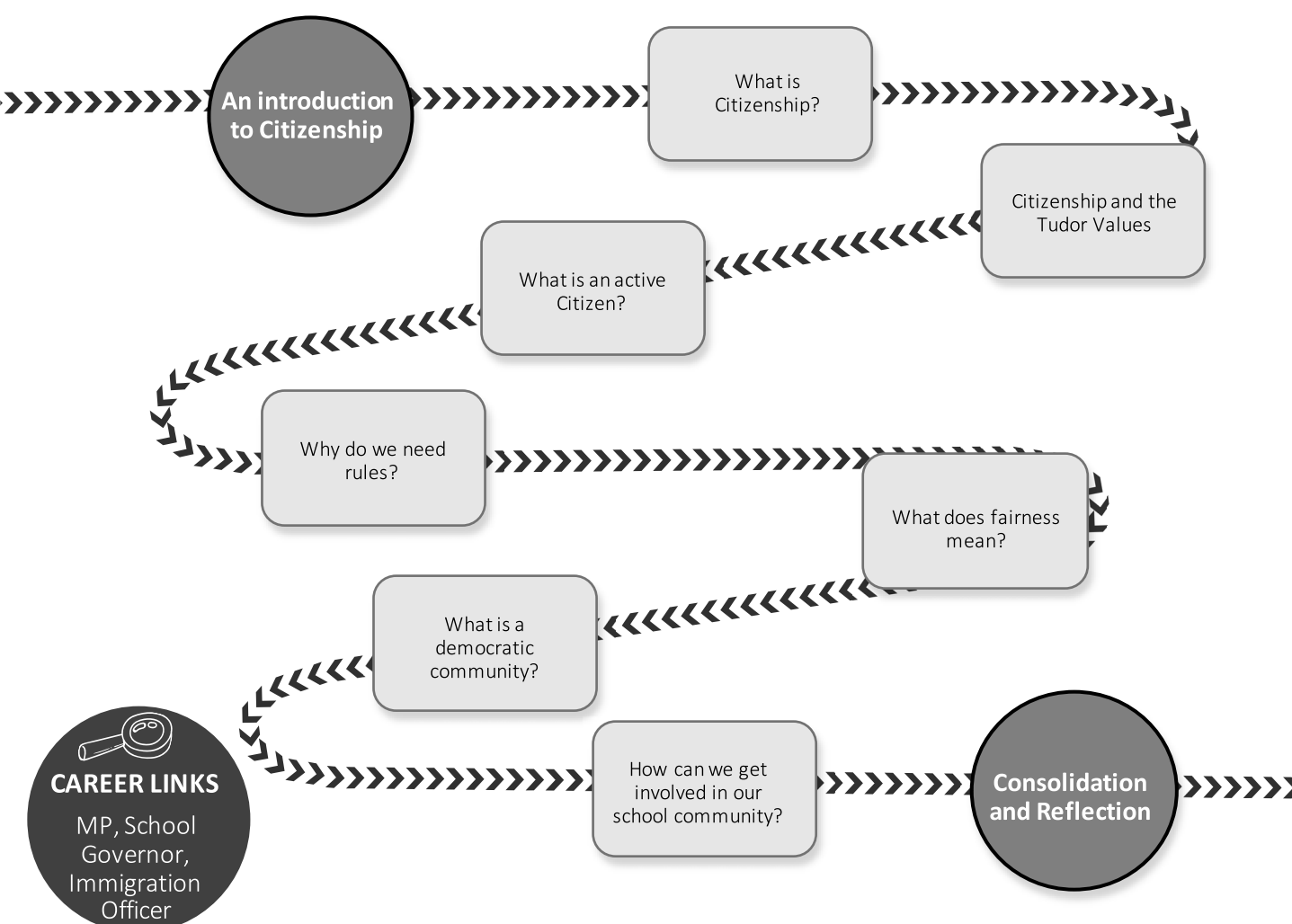
Citizenship

Year 7 - Autumn Term 1
